

Coordinated School Health Finance Policy

Effective July 1, 2021

Coordinated School Health (CSH) expenditures **must** support the LEA's CSH action plan goals and/or one of the eight components of Coordinated School Health.

- Health Education
- Health Services
- Nutrition
- Physical Education/Physical Activity
- Healthy School Environment
- School Counseling, Psychological, and Social Services
- Student, Family, and Community Involvement
- Staff Wellness

Basic Guidance

- Coordinators are strongly encouraged to recruit community partners to either donate or provide a match for Coordinated School Health expenditures whenever possible.
- Verify the expenditure is not more appropriately aligned to other funding sources (Examples: ESSER, Safe Schools, etc.)
- All expenditures over \$1,000 for items other than salaries and benefits must be pre-approved by the Office of Coordinated School Health.
- Please note items on the approved list exceeding \$1,000 must still be submitted via the purchase request form
- Pre-approval from the state coordinator is required before using Coordinated School Health funds for outof-state travel.
- Any changes to the Coordinated School Health budget must be recorded in ePlan and approved. A
 budget narrative must accompany the requested budget change.
- Item requests may be considered on a case-by-case basis by submitting the required <u>form</u> and obtaining prior approval from the Office of Coordinated School Health.

Examples of organizations include TNSCH, TAHPERD, etc.	Large quantities of t-shirts (purchases of t-shirts will be approved on a case-by-case basis and must be for a CSH-sponsored event/activity)
	Professional development for health- related staff	Office furniture (desks, chairs, tables, cabinets, shelves)
	Mini grants that address one of the eight components of CSH	In-state flights
	Computers and/or printers used ONLY by CSH staff	Speakers for assemblies (only in rare circumstances will OCSH make an exemption to paying for speakers)
	Printing costs (large quantities)

Promotional	Limited quantities of CSH incentives or promotional items (notepads, pens, water bottles, etc.)	Personal t-shirts, Jackets, cardigans, polos.
