Reminders When Assisting Students to Self Administer Medications in the School Setting

- 1. Concentrate all efforts on the task assigned.
- 2. Be sure that the <u>Right medication</u> is being administered to the <u>Right student</u> in the <u>Right amount</u> at the <u>Right time</u> and by the <u>Right route</u>.
- 3. Be sure there is written parent authorization and medication administration record' sheet for each medication given.
- 4. Be sure the information on the label of the pharmacy container, the parent authorization and the medication administration record sheet all match
- 5. Identify the student
- 6. Check the label and the medication administration record sheet before removing the medication from the pharmacy container.
- 7. Do not give a medication if you cannot read the label on the container
- 8. When measuring liquids make sure the quantity is measured at eye level.
- 9. When pouring liquids hold the bottle in a way that you pour away from the label side of the bottle so the liquid does not drip and obscure the label.
- 10. Wipe the liquid from the rim of the bottle with a clean piece of paper or tissue before returning the cap.
- 11. Be sure the student has taken the medication before he/she leaves the medication administration area.
- 12. Never record a medication as being given until it has been administered.
- 13. Hands should not touch medications
- 14. When pouring tablets or capsules, pour medication from the container into the container cap. Then Pour medication from the cap to a cup if available.
- 15. Do not leave the medication area unattended when medicines are being administered.
- 16. Do Not "borrow" medication from one student to give to another.
- 17. Do Not "combine" a student's medications.
- 18. Do Not "store or keep" medications at the end of the school year.
